Fall 2020 Semester

SVA is adopting a **hybrid plan**.

A combination of classes:

- in-person
- online

Start date: **September 28, 2020**

This current plan is contingent upon the NYC entering phase 4 (NYC is currently under phase 3 as of 7.16.2020).



COVID-19 Safety


With the strict safety guidelines by the New York State Department of Health, SVA is preparing a safe environment for students to take in-person classes including reduced class sizes, limited capacity in common areas, required face covering, required health check-in and more.

New F-1 Requirements RESCINDED

The new guidance for Fall 2020 announced on **July 6, 2020** by The Student and Exchange Visitor Program (SEVP) was removed on **July 14, 2020**.

ISO, in coordination with the College, interpreted the guidance announced in **March 2020** amid COVID-19 and how it applies to Fall 2020 for international students at SVA.

Successful Lobbying!

- A lawsuit/legal complaint by Harvard University and MIT joined by Google, Microsoft, Facebook and more.
 - A separate lawsuit by the State of California
 - A lawsuit by 17 states and the District of Columbia
 - Presidents' Alliance Amicus Brief (opinion from the field) filed by 180 institutions including SVA

Important Points

For Current / Returning Students

Regardless of your choice* for the fall 2020 semester,

- You can remain in the U.S. to study.
- You may return to the U.S. for the fall 2020 semester.

"You must leave the U.S. if you plan to take all of your courses online for the fall semester."

For New Students

 You may apply for an F-1 visa*, enter the U.S. to study for the fall 2020 semester unless you plan to take all of your courses online (see the Transfer Student section for new transfer students).

*You must be registered full-time (minimum 12 credits)

Who may enter/return to the U.S.?

From what we know as of July 16, 2020

- Current / Returning Students whether you plan to:
 - study fully online,
 - attend in-person classes, or
 - take a combination of both.
- New Students including Transfer Students who plan to:
 - attend in-person classes, or
 - take a combination of both.

Current/Returning Students

Current Students Returning to SVA For Fall 2020

ALL Current / Returning Students

Currently inside the U.S.

- You can remain in the U.S. to study for the fall 2020 semester whether you plan to:
 - 1. study fully online,
 - 2. attend in-person classes, or
 - 3. take a combination of both.

Currently outside of the U.S.

- You can continue to stay outside of the U.S. and take all of your courses online for the fall 2020 semester.
- You may return to the U.S.* to study for the fall 2020 semester with a valid passport and F-1 visa.
- Your F-1 status will remain active as long as you are registered full-time, make normal progress, and successfully complete the fall semester.

Five-Month Rule

The five-month rule does not apply:

- 1. while the COVID-19 guidance in place, and
- 2. your F-1 status remains active.
- Your F-1 status remains active as long as you are registered full-time, make normal progress, and complete the fall 2020 semester.
- You do not need to apply for a new F-1
 visa (as long as your current one is valid)
 even if you are outside of the U.S. for
 longer than 5 months.
- You can use your current I-20 as long as it has a valid travel signature.

Taking A Leave of Absence (Gap Year)

- Discuss with your academic advisor and request a leave of absence, in writing.
- If you are in the U.S., you must leave the U.S. within 15 days from the date of notification.
- Your F-1 status will be reset when returning to start your program so you will have to be enrolled for one academic year again in order to be eligible to apply for CPT or OPT.

New Students

New students starting in the Fall 2020 Semester including the students transferring from other US institutions

Take All Classes Online - New Student

New Student outside the U.S.

- You can take classes online outside of the U.S.
- You will not be able to apply for an F-1 visa for Fall 2020.
- Your I-20 will be deferred to Spring 2021 (your F-1 status will not be activated in the fall 2020).

Transfer Student **inside** of the U.S.

 You can continue to stay in the U.S. and take all classes online.

Transfer Student **outside** of the U.S.

- You may remain outside of the U.S. to take all classes online, however -
- Your I-20 will not be activated until the next semester when you return to the U.S. to study full-time.

Take Some Classes In-Person - New Student

New Student outside of the U.S.

- You may apply for an F-1 visa if the U.S. Embassy/Consulate in your home country resumes F-1 visa processing.
- You may enter the U.S.* to study for the fall 2020 semester.

Transfer Student **inside** of the U.S.

 You can continue to stay in the U.S. to study for the fall 2020 semester.

Transfer Student **outside** of the U.S.

 You may return to the U.S.*. to study for the fall 2020 semester with a valid passport and F-1 visa.

Deferral of Admission

- Newly admitted students can request their admission to be deferred to a future term.
 It is only granted for a maximum of one academic year. If longer than a year, you will be required to reapply.
- Discuss with your academic department and contact the Office of Admissions.

Travel

Travel guidance for current and new students who are eligible to enter the U.S.

- → Any affecting travel restrictions must be lifted before your entry to the U.S
- → U.S. Embassy/Consulate in your home country must resume F-1 visa processing if you need to apply for an F-1 visa.

Traveling to the U.S.

Travel Documents:

- Passport (valid six months into the future)
- Valid F-1 visa
- I-20 with a valid travel signature*
- Copy of the <u>SVA Fall 2020 announcement</u>
- Copy of your fall 2020 schedule

*For current/returning students: You can request a new travel I-20 if your travel signature is expired.Link: <u>iso.sva.edu</u>

New Students with Initial I-20



- You can only enter the U.S. 30 days before the fall program starts (an exception applies to transfer students).
- Your initial I-20 does not need a travel signature, page 2 should be blank.
- The U.S. Embassy /Consulate must resume F-1 visa processing and you must obtain an F-1 visa before your entry to the U.S.

U.S. Embassies and Consulates - Applying For an F-1 Visa

- → Some of the U.S. Embassies and Consulates resumed routine visa processing.
- → Certain U.S. Embassies and Consulates are accepting **expedited appointment requests.**
 - → Check your local US Embassy or Consulate website for updated information.
