As a recipient of Federal Student Aid (also called Title IV funds) you have options regarding how some of the aid is applied to your student account. The amount of federal funds credited to your account is limited to “allowable charges” only. Allowable charges are defined as tuition and fees and/or room and board agreements with the School of Visual Arts. Federal student aid funds may be used to cover other institutional charges, such as late fees and fines, only with your authorization. If you are eligible for Federal financial aid in excess of tuition and standard fees, and you wish to use this excess to cover other charges, you must authorize School of Visual Arts to pay these charges with your excess Title IV funds.

If this form is not signed or not authorized, any fees other than tuition, department fee, health insurance, course fees or housing would need to be paid directly by the student. If left unpaid the account will become past due. You have the option of canceling this authorization at any time by notifying this office of your decision in writing. This authorization will remain in effect unless/until you cancel it.
